

**National Workshop**  
**On**  
**Forging Partnership: Capacity Building for**  
**Disaster Risk Reduction**  
**21-22 May 2018**

**Background:**

NIDM, under the Andhra Re-organization Act 2014, is in the process of establishing its Southern Campus which is currently operating from APHRDI, Bapatla. Government of Andhra Pradesh has allocated land for NIDM's Southern Campus at Kondapavuluru Village, Gannavaram Mandal, Krishna District. Hon'ble Vice President of India has kindly consented to grace the occasion and lay the Foundation Stone of NIDM, Southern Campus on May 22, 2018 at 10:00 am. The dignitaries from Central Government and State Governments have been invited to be a part of the auspicious ceremony. The Hon'ble Governor of Andhra Pradesh and the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh will also be gracing the occasion.

To commemorate this occasion, NIDM is organizing a 2-days national workshop on **"Forging Partnership: Capacity Building for DRR"** from 21- 22 May 2018 at Hotel D. V. Manor, Vijayawada. The aim of the workshop is making India a disaster resilient country, enhance and build the capacity of the state institutions by building partnership between the various stakeholders.

Sendai Framework for Disaster risk Reduction and Hon'ble Prime Minister's 10 point agenda have to be integrated with capacity development initiative. NIDM being the nodal agency for capacity building has taken initiative to bring stakeholders engaged in CB at one platform and develop partnership for the future.

The NIDM-SC could be functioning to support the overall goal of providing inputs and building capacity of various stakeholders through programs. There may be programs pre-destined or would have been developed based on feedback from States. But with changing socio-politic scenarios, climate change situation and increasing events of hazards in the country, there could be a need to relook. The South India Geography could play vital role in designing the NIDM programs- Coastal Areas, Rocky terrain of Deccan Plateau and Western Ghats. It would be vital for the NIDM-SC to focus more on the needs of South India hazard profile and develop as centre for excellence.

It is known fact that children and women are most vulnerable to both natural and human induced hazards, but presently the issues is not addressed as much as it as to in the context of Preparedness and Resilience. The role of specialised UN agencies, INGOs, National and State NGOs working on children and women have played less role in the training and capacity building programs of NIDM.

## **Why the consultation:**

- Each of the States have their own Administrative Training Institutes (named differently), State Institutes related to Rural Development, Urban Management, Education, Health etc., specializing in their own subject. Disaster Management also being a specialized subject and the impact of Hazards does impact all sectors, it becomes important that ATI's in the first place need to re-look its capacity building program with new initiatives of NIDM.
- NIDM framework of action with new shift in capacity development to be integrated.
- ATI should also be informed/ shared about the programmes of the other stakeholders-national and international agencies where they can find synergy and engaged into partnerships.
- It is also important for the consultation to develop capacity building program matrix, so as not to duplicate programs between ATIs and NIDM. It could also ensure to hold programs that are in nature of Advocacy, Policy changes, program re-designing (existing programs), and new skills for mainstreaming DRR/CCA and how to monitor the training programs conducted by NIDM is transferred to the ground level.
- The DRR action plan should have special focus on different groups including Child Centric DRR. The workshop would also provide an opportunity to discuss the framework of action and identify partners for its implementation.
- Finally, in majority of our capacity building programs, the child aspect is missing. Most states have child protection policy, our welfare programs are mainly directed to children, women and families. Hence, the concepts of families have to be integrated in the capacity building programs.
- We do see that in disaster situation, protection of women and children are not considered and that leads to abuse, violence against them. Hence, the training programs need to address those issues.
- During the last couple of years, there is discussion on risk transfer mechanism and financial resilience for States after a disaster; Climate change is leading to drought in many states, hence the NIDM could consider having an exclusive unit for addressing this issue.

## **Program Design:**

The programme is of two days . 21<sup>st</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup> May 2018 at Hotel DV Manor, Vijaywada, Andhra Pradesh.

The participating institutions agree to draw out long term capacity building programs, that could lead to building the capacity of State DM institutions and officials through general and tailor made programs

Agreement on a common minimum programme that could lead to achieving desired milestones over a period of 5 years and at the same time the NIDM /NIDM- South campus could evolve as specialised Centre for Multi hazard .
