Background:

Disaster risk is increasing globally due to the growing exposure of human activities, combined with increasing vulnerabilities and the effects of climate change and global warming. Recent Global Assessment Report 2022 by United Nations Disaster Risk Reduction (UNDRR) indicates that if current trends continue, the number of disasters per year globally may increase from 400 in 2015 to 560 events per year by 2030. It is a projected increase of 40 % during the lifetime of Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (2015-2030).

Mainstreaming Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) into Development and Disaster Management Plans through various resilience measures is an important mandate of the Disaster Management Act 2005. In line with this Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi outlined a 10-point agenda for efforts toward disaster risk reduction, in an address, he delivered at the Asian Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction held in New Delhi in November 2016. These agendas focused on imbibing disaster risk reduction principles and strategies by all developmental sectors, working towards risk coverage for all from poor households to multi-national corporations and developing a network of universities to work on disaster issues. The Prime Minister's Agenda also recognizes the importance of involving research institutions and the wider academia in advancing the understanding of disasters.

During the 3rd Session of National Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction Hon'ble Prime Minister emphasized the concept of Recognition and reform. The concept of recognition and reform in disaster management is closely linked to mainstreaming Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR). Recognition, as mentioned, refers to understanding the possibility of disasters and their potential impacts. On the other hand, reform entails implementing measures and policies that reduce the possibility and impact of disasters. Mainstreaming DRR focuses on incorporating these recognition and reform principles into ongoing and new schemes related to construction and infrastructure. By integrating DRR measures into the planning, design, and implementation of such projects, the aim is to reduce the vulnerability of communities and minimize the damage caused by disasters.

There are three suggested approaches of mainstreaming disaster management into the development process and disaster management.

15th Finance Commission Guidelines:

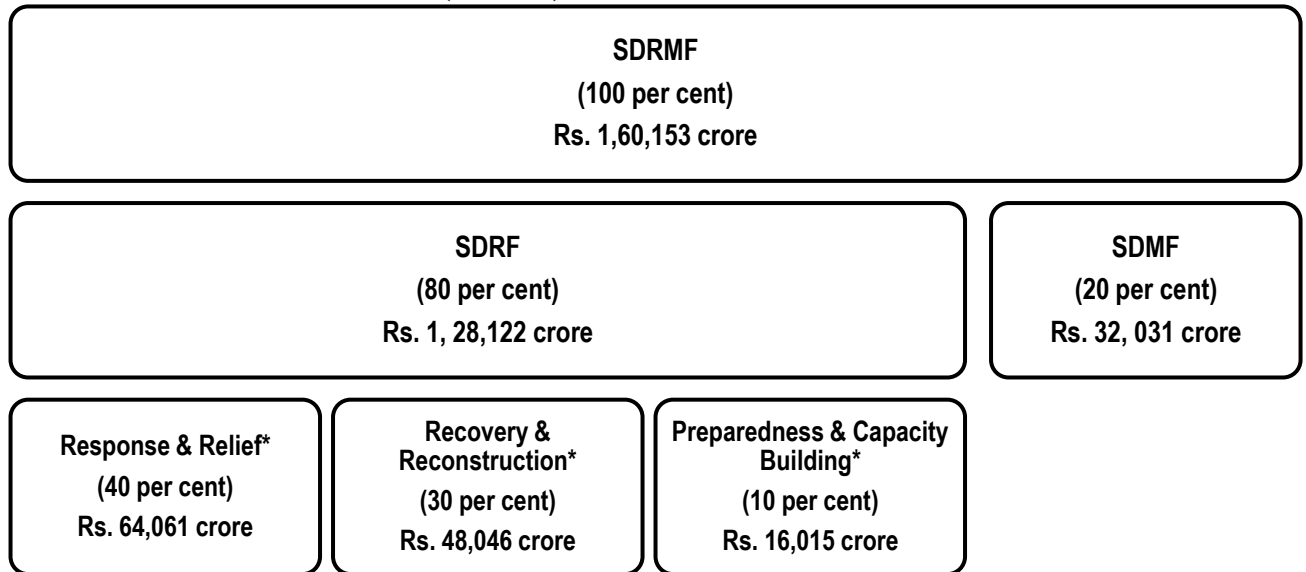
Fifteenth Finance Commission has recommended a total allocation of Rs. 1, 60,153 crore for the State Disaster Risk Management Fund (SDRMF) to the States for the award period 2021-



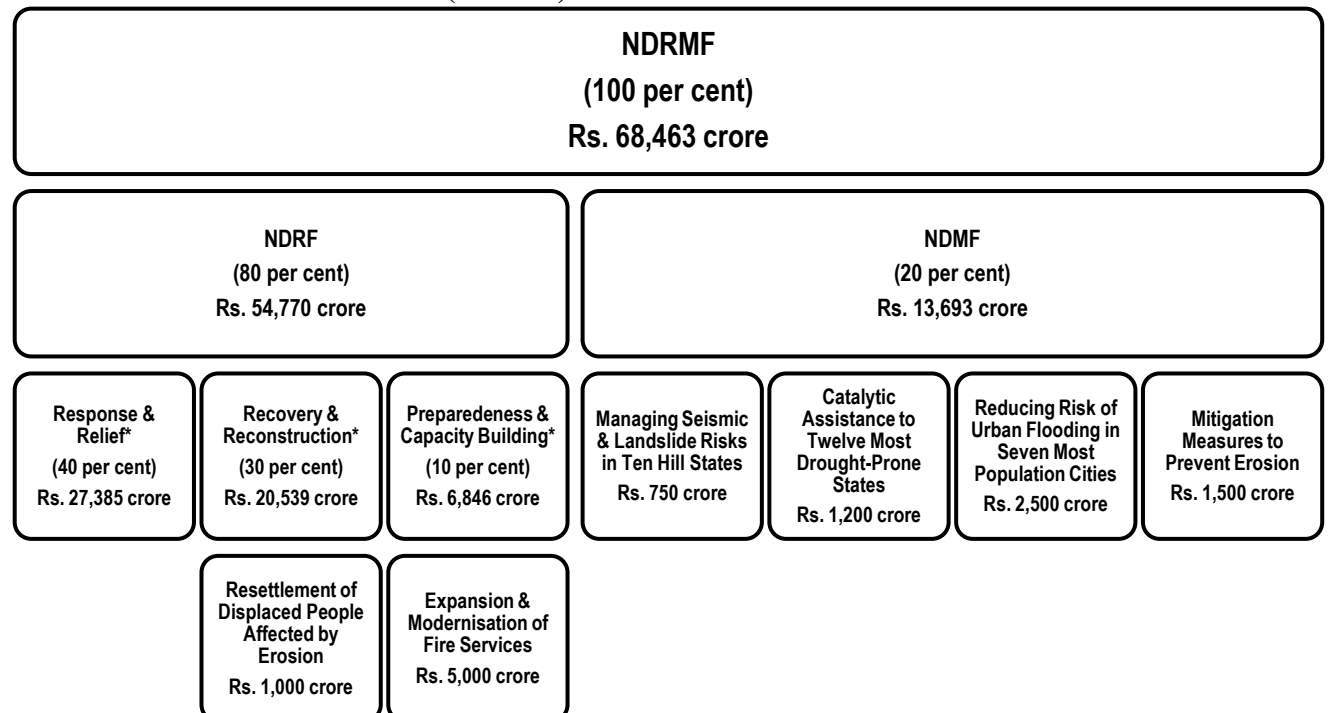
26. Further, the total State allocation for SDRMF has been divided into State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) and State Disaster Mitigation Fund (SDMF), which will together address the full cycle of disaster management needs — response and relief, recovery and reconstruction, preparedness and capacity-building, and mitigation.

The SDRF would receive 80 per cent of the total SDRMF, while the SDMF would get 20 per cent of the allocation. Within the SDRF there would be three sub allocations: (i) Response and Relief (40 per cent), (ii) Recovery and Reconstruction (30 per cent) and (iii) Preparedness and Capacity-building (10 per cent).

Earmarked Funds for NDRMF (15th FC)



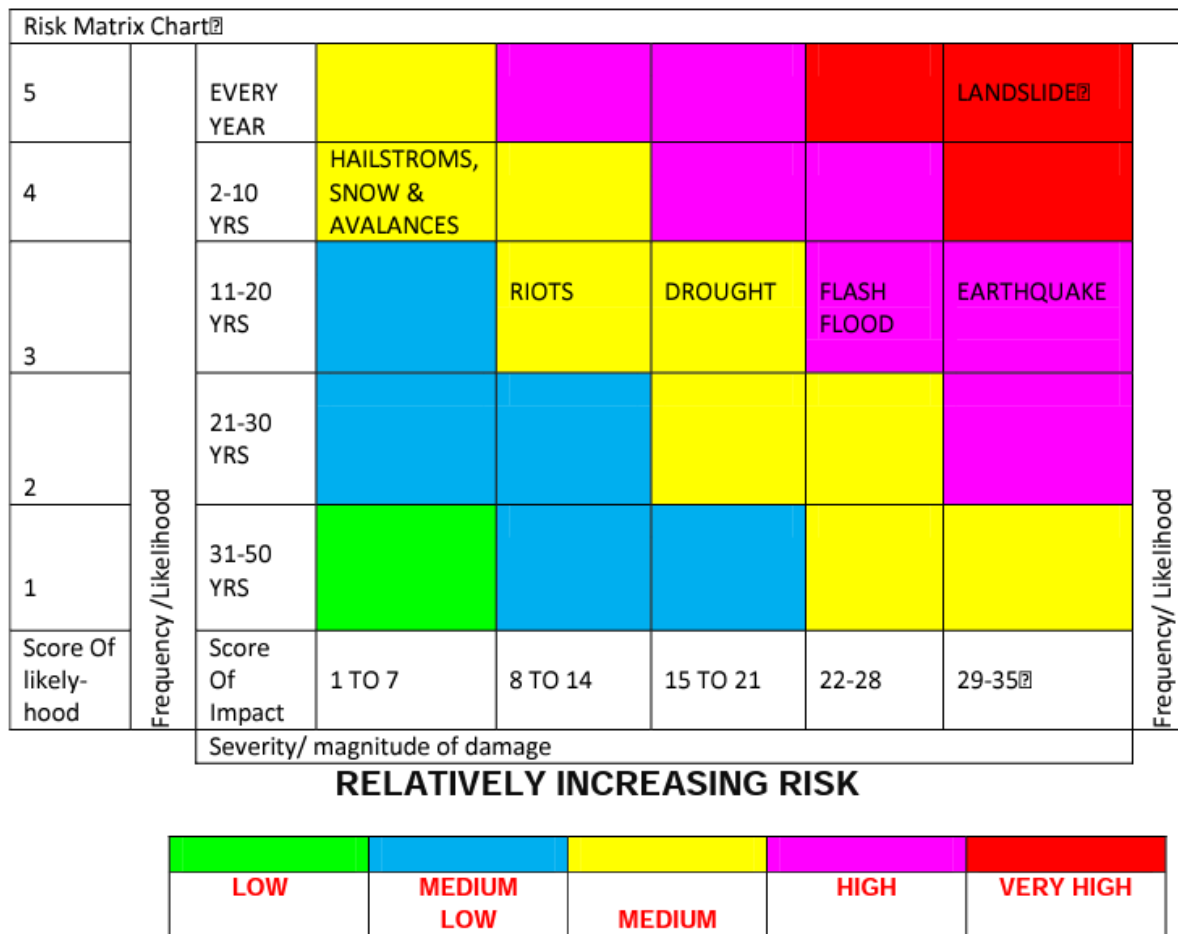
Vulnerability profile of Sikkim

Sikkim is a landlocked Indian state nestled in the Himalayas. The state borders Nepal to the west, Tibet to the north and east, and Bhutan to the southeast. The state of West Bengal borders Sikkim to its south.

With just slightly over 600,000 permanent residents, Sikkim is the least populous state in India and the second-smallest state after Goa in total area. The entire state is mountainous, with altitudes ranging from 300 to 8,586 meters from sea level, therefore despite its small area of 7,096 km² (2,740 sq mi), Sikkim is geographically diverse. The climate ranges from subtropical to high alpine and a rich diversity in flora and fauna thrives in the state. Kanchenjunga, the world's third-highest peak, is located on Sikkim's border with Nepal. Sikkim is a popular tourist destination, owing to its culture, scenery and biodiversity. The state has three major ethnic groups, namely the Lepchas, Bhutias, and Nepalis.

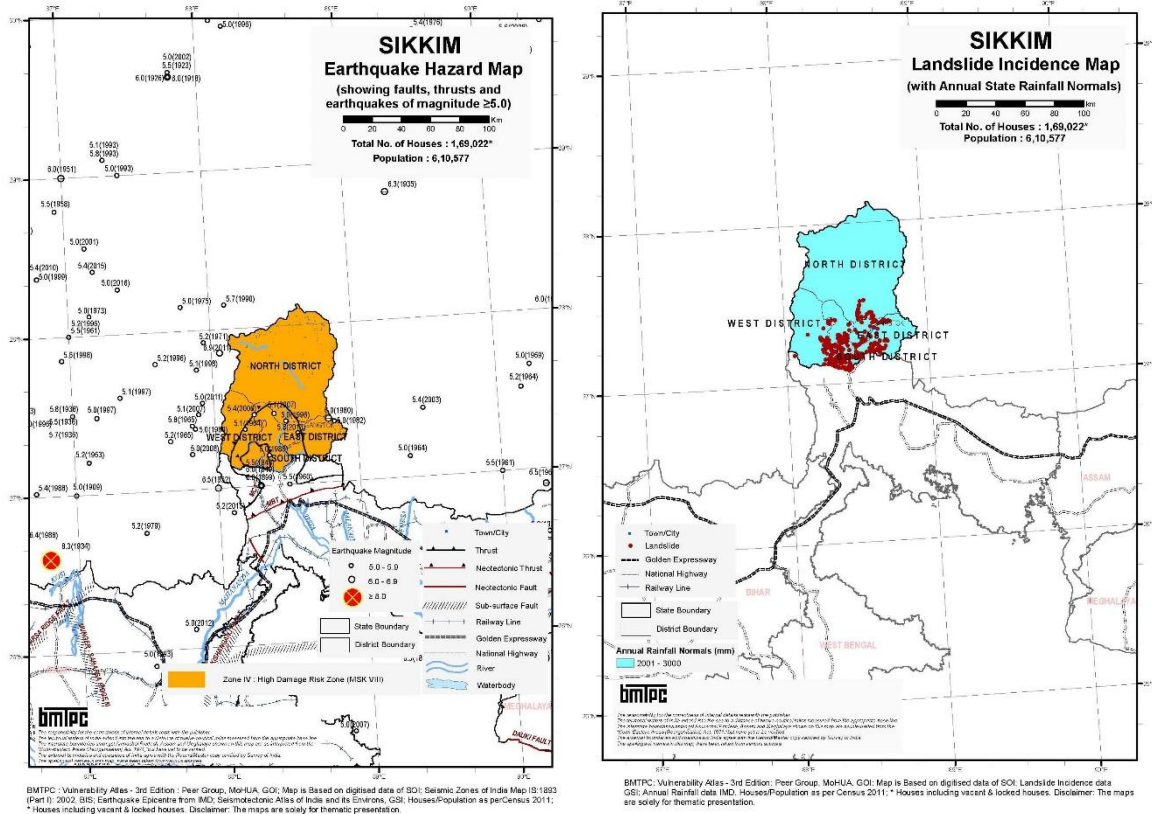
The state of Sikkim lying in the foothill of Himalayas is prone to all natural hazards (Earthquake, Landslide, Cloud Burst and Flash Flood, Fire, Avalanche and GLOF, Hailstorm, Thunderstorm and Lightning, Drought, Windstorm, Chemical, Vehicular Accidents, etc.)

Multi-Hazard Risk Vulnerability of Sikkim:



Earthquake: The state falls within the seismic zone IV which is prone to frequent earthquake occurrences resulting to loss of lives and infrastructures.

Landslide: The state of Sikkim is susceptible to landslides owing to the slope instability, weak composition of the soil or rock structures. Some of the factors causing slope instability are rain, flooding, seismic events, removal of vegetation, construction activities, etc.



Cloudburst and Flash Flood: The higher reaches of the state have catchment area which is susceptible to high precipitation resulting to cloud burst which in turn causes flash flood along the river basin causing damages to life, livestock and properties. During the monsoon season cloudburst resulting to flash flood are frequent occurrence in all districts of the State.

Cyclone: The cyclonic effects over Bay of Bengal is often felt in the state causing heavy incessant rainfall in the State, in turn increasing vulnerability to landslide, flash flood and flooding of lakes and rivers.

Thunderstorm and Lightning: During the pre-monsoon and monsoon season, thunderstorm and lightning occurrences prevail throughout the state causing extensive damages to life and properties.

Hailstorm, Fire, Avalanche & GLOF are some other major hazards of the state.

Aim: To enhance the capacity of Govt. officials concerning NDMIS, & Mainstreaming DRR into development sectoral schemes.



Objectives of Training:

1. To enhance understanding of NDMIS & IDRN and provide hands-on training.
2. To Familiarize with State Disaster Response and Mitigation Fund
3. To sensitize the participants on DRR Measures and Mainstreaming in Development Works.

Training Summary:

Day-1:15/05/2023

Inaugural Session:

The inaugural session began with Welcome Address by the esteemed Director of the Advanced Training Institute (ATI) in Sikkim. The address shed light on the vulnerability of Sikkim to various hazards and emphasized the significance of learning from past events. Recent and ongoing weather events were discussed, along with the proactive actions being taken by both the state and central governments to mitigate risks effectively. The Director highlighted Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and Disaster Risk Management (DRM) as key elements for sustainable and resilient development. The training programme was introduced as a valuable opportunity for stakeholders to acquire new methods, tools, and technologies related to the National Disaster Management Information System (NDMIS), National Disaster Management Fund (NDMF) / State Disaster Management Fund (SDMF), National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) / State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), and mainstreaming DRR.

Context Setting and Overview of the Programme

Dr. Garima, a renowned Senior Consultant from the Research and Innovation Division (RID) of NIDM, delivered an insightful presentation on NIDM's role in Disaster Risk Mitigation and Capacity Building. Dr. Garima highlighted the importance and understanding of the training programme, providing an overview of the vulnerability profile of the country. Key topics covered included the National Disaster Management Information System (NDMIS) and its maintenance and development by the National Informatics Centre (NIC). Dr. Garima also stressed the significance of mainstreaming DRR and Climate Change Adaptation (CCA) based on lessons learned from recent disasters, such as the Odisha train disaster. The session further underscored the importance of building the capacity of human resources and ensuring the safety of critical infrastructure.

Inaugural Address:

The Inaugural Address was delivered by the esteemed Director of the Sikkim State Disaster Management Authority (SDMA), who introduced the profiles of the participants and highlighted the need for hands-on training specifically tailored to NDMIS components for Sikkim. The address touched upon the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) guidelines and the role of the 15th Finance Commission. Issues related to the segregation of damages were acknowledged as crucial areas requiring attention, and the Director explored ways to strengthen SDMA's in the field of Disaster Management.

Session I:SFDRR monitoring system- NDMIS and its key features was presented by Dr. Sreeja S. Nair, Fellow, TERI

The session started with presentation on SFDRR monitoring system.

The following was detailed in the presentation:

- The Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030 and seven clear targets and four priorities for action to prevent new and reduce existing disaster risks



- The aim, objective, scope purpose, and goal of Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030.
- Two components of NDMIS portal: The first component for reporting the data related to State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) and National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) from the districts to state, and from state to center was explained.
- To develop skills on maintaining data in the NDMIS SFM Module and user admin at state level.

Session II: SDRF monitoring system- NDMIS presented by Shri. Vikram Gujar.

The following was presented in the session:

- SDRF monitoring system and the fund entry part on SDRF module.
- The guidelines on constitution and administration of the SDRF.
- NDMIS portal and the basic feature.

Session III: Hands on Training on NDMIS Sendai Framework Monitoring System and State Disaster Response Fund was dealt by Dr. Sreeja S. Nair, Fellow, TERI
