**Terms of Reference for Impact Evaluation of Training Courses conducted by NIDM  
between 2005-2012**

**Background**

The National Institute of Disaster Management constituted under the Disaster Management Act 2005 has been entrusted with the nodal national responsibility for human resource development, capacity building, training, research, documentation and policy advocacy in the field of disaster management. NIDM is steadily marching forward to fulfill its mission to make a disaster resilient India by developing and promoting a culture of prevention and preparedness at all levels. Developing training modules is one of the tasks entrusted to the Institute among others.

NIDM conducts both on campus and off campus training courses on various areas of disaster management regularly. The participants of the NIDM courses are mainly senior and middle level officers from the State and Districts who are responsible for coordination and operation in disaster situations. In addition, faculty members from State Administrative Training Institute, State Institute of Rural Development and other National and State level training institutions as well as senior & middle level officers of Central Government Ministries/Departments/Agencies also attend the courses. On campus courses are conducted in Delhi at Institute's premises while off campus courses are conducted at State Administrative Training Institutes/Other training Institutes. A few off campus courses are also conducted at the district level in association with State Governments/District Administration.

**Invitation of Proposal**

Technical and financial proposals are invited for hiring Consultancy Services to evaluate the impact of Training Programmes conducted by NIDM during the period 2005-06 to 2011-12. Details of courses conducted by NIDM is at **Appendix-A**.

**Objectives:**

- a) To evaluate the overall impact of training programmes conducted by the Institute.
- b) To evaluate the feedbacks of the participants in the training programs and also to have personal discussions with them to get first hand information on efficacy of the courses.
- c) To interact with various stakeholders and participants for effective implementation of the training programme.
- d) To assess the achievements of the courses in terms of objectives.
- e) To suggest the modifications in the training courses for further improvements.
- f) To suggest improvements in training methodologies and delivery mechanism.

**Scope of the Assignment/ Tasks to be performed:**

The identified consultant is required to perform the following tasks:

- a) To devise a suitable approach and methodology to evaluate the impact of the training courses already conducted by NIDM.
- b) To evaluate the effectiveness of the training courses.
- c) To evaluate the methodology adopted for delivery of training courses,
- d) To interact with participants of the training courses, to assess the extent of usefulness of the courses.
- e) To evaluate the feedback received from the participants on the overall quality of sessions/lectures and course materials at the end of the training courses and the use of the same in the future.
- f) To suggest modifications in the proposed training courses for better and effective use by the targeted trainees.
- g) To verify the participants profile and to suggest for further improvement in selection process of participants.

**Schedule of completion of the Tasks:**

The assignment has to be completed within a period of 6 months from the date of award of work :

- Feedback of participants of on campus courses
- Any other report/information required to complete the assignment.

**Final outputs required from the consultant:** The final report including the feedback received from the participants comments on course materials, program schedule, facility during the training program, impact of training program on the participants and the effectiveness of the program. The final report should be provided in hard copies (min.3 sets) and also in the electronic form to NIDM.

**Composition of Review Committee and procedure to Monitor consultant works:** A review committee would be constituted by Executive Director, NIDM to evaluate the performance and monitor the progress of this Consultancy assignment.

### **Deliverables**

#### **Payment schedule**

The payment shall be released in the following manner:

- a) 20% after submission of Inception Report
- b) 40% after submission of Draft Impact Evaluation Report
- c) 35 % after submission of Final Impact Evaluation Report
- d) 5% after the acceptance/ final approval of NIDM

### **Submission of Proposal**

The proposals should be submitted separately in two parts; Technical Proposal and Financial Proposal.

### **Technical Proposal**

The Technical Proposal should provide the following information using the attached Standard Forms :

- (i) A brief description of the firm's organisation and an outline of recent experience on assignments of a similar nature. For each assignment, the outline should indicate, inter-alia, the profiles and names of the staff provided, duration of the assignment, contract amount, and firm's involvement. **(Tech-1)**
- (ii) Any comments or suggestions on the Terms of Reference and on the data, a list of services, and facilities to be provided by the NIDM **(Tech-2)**
- (iii) A Description of the Approach, Methodology and Work Plan for the performing the Assignment . **(Tech-3)**
- (iv) The list of the proposed staff Experts/Specialists/Professionals and their Task Assignments **((Tech-4)**
- (v) Written consent of the Proposed Professionals to continue for the duration of assignment. and their Curriculum Vitae (CV) **(Tech-5)**
- (vi) Time schedule for professional personnel **(Tech-6)**

### **Financial Proposal**

*The Financial Proposals* should include total cost in the Lump-Sum exclusive of all taxes. Corrections, overwriting etc. shall not be accepted in the Financial Proposal. Amount to be quoted in Indian Rupees.

### **Opening and Evaluation of Proposals**

All Proposals received by the due date will be opened on the same day of submission by 1600 hrs, by a duly constituted Committee in the presence of bidders who choose to attend.

Technical Evaluation will be made by an Evaluation Committee as per the set criterion as deemed appropriate. Once technical evaluation is completed, NIDM will inform the Bidders/Consultants who have submitted proposals with the technical scores obtained by their Technical Proposals.

NIDM will also notify those Consultants whose Proposals did not meet the minimum qualifying mark of 75 out of 100 points or were considered not conforming to the TOR, and their Financial Proposals will be returned unopened after completing the selection process.

**The minimum technical score required to pass is : 75 points**

NIDM will notify Consultants that have secured the minimum qualifying mark, the date, time and location for opening the Financial Proposals. Consultants' attendance at the opening of Financial Proposals is optional. Financial Proposals shall be opened publicly in the presence of the Consultants' representatives who choose to attend. Any inconsistency in Financial Proposal from that of Technical Proposal shall be liable to be rejected by the Evaluation Committee.

### **Method of Selection**

Quality-Cost Based Selection (QCBS) shall be adopted for selection of the Consultant for developing the Modules. Under QCBS, the lowest evaluated Financial Proposal (Fm) will be given the maximum financial score (Sf) of 100 points. The financial scores (Sf) of the other Financial Proposals will be computed as under:-

$Sf=100 \times Fm/F$  in which Sf is financial score, Fm is the lowest price and F is the price of the proposal under consideration. The weight given to the Technical and Financial proposals would be Technical= 0.7 and Financial=0.3

Proposals will be ranked according to their combined technical (St) and financial (Sf) scores using the weights (T = the weight given to the Technical Proposal; P = the weight given to the Financial Proposal; T + P = 1) as indicated above.

Final Score =  $St \times T\% + Sf \times P\%$ . The firm achieving the highest combined technical and financial score will be awarded the work.
