

Collect from
a protected
water point



Treat by boiling/
chlorination/
ceramic filters

Store water safely;
cover to prevent
contamination



Avoid contaminating
water by touching while
filling, transporting or
pouring

Clean and disinfect surrounding areas



Dispose all waste according to instructions from authorities



Do not spit in the open



Remove stagnant water around house/camp to prevent breeding of mosquitoes


Always use

What to carry in your Go-Bag: When you are facing a flood situation you need to carry essential items. Tick what you have put in the go-bag



Emergency contact information



Original and duplicate copies of vital records and documents must be kept in plastic waterproof bag and/or in digilocker



First-aid kits



Soap



Masks



Sanitary pad



Torch with extra batteries



Plastic bags and string to tie



Water purification tablets



Prescribed medications



Plastic sheet and duct tape



Multipurpose tool 'knife'



Matches and whistle



Set of dry clothes and towels
