

National Level Training Programme on Integrating DRR into SDGs with reference to SFDRR and COP 21 18 - 22 February 2019

BACKGROUND

NIDM has been mandated by Sub-section 8 and 9, Section 42, Chapter 7 of Disaster Management Act 2005 to develop training modules and educational materials, undertake training, research, documentation and publication for capacity development and dissemination of knowledge / information related to disaster management, assist in formulation of policies, strategies and frameworks for disaster risk reduction as well as promote awareness among different stakeholders for enhancing human capacity to avoid, prevent, mitigate, prepare, respond and recover efficiently in a proactive, holistic and integrated manner.

The Institute has been organizing various training courses and conducting seminars / workshops / conferences covering wide spectrum of themes at the national and international levels besides publishing several training modules and other documents including case studies, templates and disaster reports.

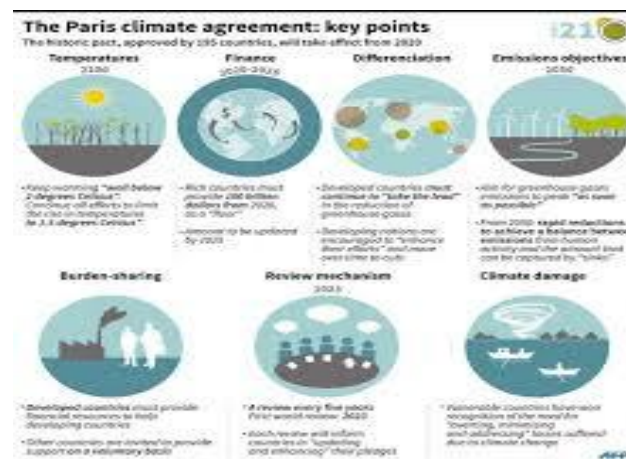
NIDM has been trying to bring various stakeholders at one platform through activities like India Disaster Management Conference, National Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction, South Asia Policy Dialogue, East Asia Summit for Earthquake Risk Reduction and Asia Ministerial Conference for Disaster Risk Reduction for better networking, linkages and coordination. The recent declarations at the international levels during the 3rd World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction at Sendai, Japan, Climate Change Summit / CoP 21, Sustainable Development goals during the year 2015 and the Prime Minister Agenda 10 in Post-Sendai AMCDRR during 2016 have also emphasized on collection action and integrated approach for Climate and Disaster Resilient Safer Sustainable Development..

The Sustainable Development Goals are the blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. They address the global challenges we face, including those related to poverty, inequality, climate, environmental degradation, prosperity, and peace and justice. The Goals interconnect and in order to leave no one behind, it is important that we achieve each Goal and target by 2030.

INTRODUCTION

It has often emerged during disasters in the developmental areas that the failures / disruptions / disasters have aggravated the damages and losses due unscientific unplanned and unregulated developments. Hence, safer sustainable development in harmony

with changing climatic and geodynamic conditions need urgent attention to manage emergencies and disaster situations. Keeping this in view, NIDM has been organizing trainings for capacity enhancement related to disaster management through the various stakeholders.



However, NIDM required strong partnership with the stakeholders in communication technologies to build useful ties between the professionals, policy and decision makers including the functionaries in disaster management authorities and departments to disseminate the right information to the right stakeholder at the right time and place for timely right action. Therefore, the Institute has planned to organize 5 days national level training programme on Integrating DRR into SDGs with reference to SFDRR and COP 21

The programme involves senior level resource persons, experts, professionals and functionaries from development, environment and disaster management sectors, who have very long and meaningful experiences with vast knowledge on the subject. During the programme, there will be presentations and panel discussions on case studies related to the integration of DRR into sustainable development with reference to SFDRR, COP21, SDGs and Urbanization Agenda including examples from India and abroad, sharing of ideas and expertise / skills related different interventions, advantages and limitations as well as issues, challenges and opportunities in reporting disaster events including the ethical perspectives. Government of India has laid down guidelines, procedures and protocols for reporting on disasters by functionaries as well as communities. The programme will provide information about such documents and key important points to be considered in disaster risk reduction and resilience including PM 10 Points Agenda.

The programme will also deliberate upon disaster networks, technologies and systems for making communities, environment, resources, structures and infrastructure disaster resilient. There will be discussions on other related themes as well

The representatives from Nodal Agencies in Disaster Management would elaborate on disasters such as earthquake, tsunami, cyclone and flood etc. to apprise concerned stakeholders about the recent developments and strategies in each sector.

It is expected that the programme would serve as a milestone for further actions in enhancing our capacities to reduce disasters and their impacts as part of the national goal to make the country disaster resilient.

- To enhance the human capacity for quick, effective and credible understanding of the disaster risks
- To identify the significant role of different stakeholders from various sectors in averting / preventing unfavorable and adverse conditions leading to disaster situations
- To provide tools for mitigation and preparedness against potential impending disasters
- To improve education, training and awareness related to disaster for decision makers, planners, professionals and citizens
- To discuss for an effective national strategy that can be applied at different levels across various sectors for efficient DRR&R
- To develop workable partnerships and linkages / networks among governance, administration, financial, legal and social Organizations as well as professionals and other stakeholders

VENUE, DURATION & COURSE FEE

The programme will be held at Conference Room, YMCA, Gate 1, Jai Singh Road, New Delhi - 110001. It will commence at 9am on Monday, 18 February 2019 and will conclude at about 6pm on Friday, 22 February 2019. The duration of the training will be 5 days. No course fee will be charged for the course. However, nominating / sponsoring organization will bear the travel expenses for attending the course while NIDM will bear the boarding and lodging expenses during the training period for the selected confirmed participants (NIDM will send confirmation email to the selected trainees). The medium of instruction will be English.

REGISTRATION

The participants will assemble in YMCA Conference Hall at 9 a.m. and will register themselves on Monday, 18 February 2019. NIDM staff will assist them in Registration.

EVALUATION OF THE PROGRAMME

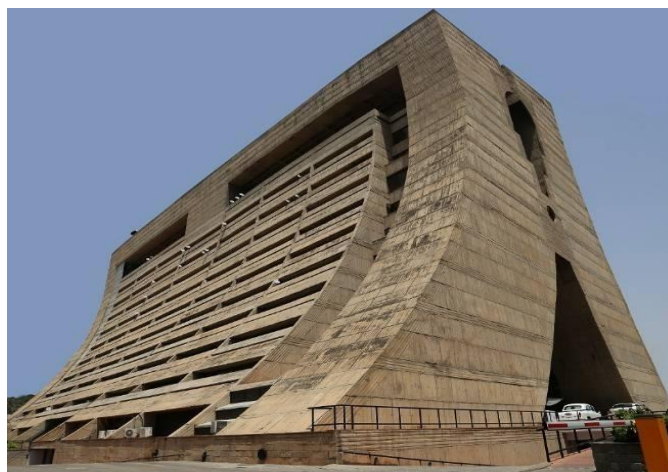
The final session of the programme will be devoted to evaluation and valediction. The participants will be supplied with an evaluation Proforma, which may be completed and handed over to the Programme staff.

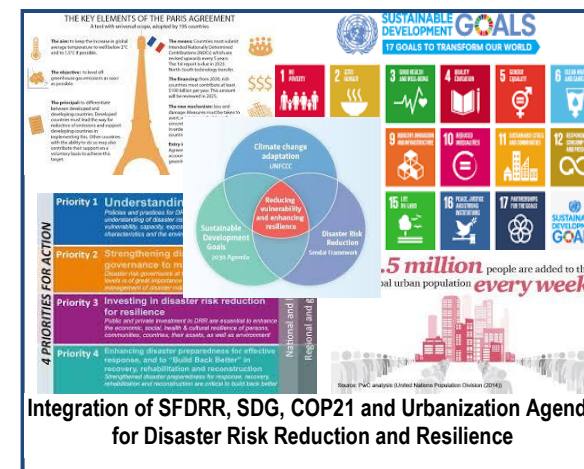
